I am a writer, editor and communications consultant. In 2020 I was awarded a writing residency in Ireland. My novel *After She Left* (Impact Press, 2019) was shortlisted for the ACT Publishers and Writers Awards. I was Blogger in Residence at *CAPITAL LETTERS*, the ACT Writers Centre's blog – <https://actwritersblog.com> – in 2016 and my personal blog (2012 to date) – <http://penhanley.wordpress.com> – focuses on writing and creativity. My last non-fiction book, *Inspiring Australians: The first fifty years of the Winston Churchill Memorial Trust* was published in 2015 by ASP. I have published books; non-fiction articles on health, women, the cinema and creativity; 85 book reviews; 20 short stories in national and international journals and online; and two novels. My book, *Creative Lives* (2009), commissioned by the NLA, was given a 5-star rating by *Bookseller + Publisher Magazine*.

September 2011 to July 2014

Media and Communications Manager, the National Rural Health Alliance (NRHA)

I wrote articles on all aspects of rural health for the two journals of the Alliance, *Partyline* and *The Australian Journal of Rural Health*, as well as for journals and websites of other health organisations across Australia. I wrote media releases and Fact Sheets, and contributed to policy discussions. I conceived the idea of infographics for their website and Facebook and helped set them up in order to get a succinct, visual message to a rural audience.

January 2010 to August 2010

Media and Communications Manager, the Australian Local Government Association (ALGA)

I wrote articles in my two weekly newsletters about the myriad issues concerning local councils, such as environmental change and its legal ramifications, infrastructure, health and education. I wrote speeches, press releases and brochures. I contributed my ideas about media strategy to policy discussions in the wide range of areas for which local councils are responsible and liaised with journalists about such topics, from climate change damaging coastal properties to the towns with the highest statistics of dog-biting. I wrote the book, *Women in Politics* (ALGA, 2010), which was distributed to local councils and libraries across Australia in the Year of Women in Local Government.

In the 20 years between degrees I wrote film reviews, book reviews, short stories and novels, and was a free-lance editor at places such as the National Film and Sound Archive. I discussed films on local radio stations ABC and 2XX. From 1990-1999 I worked as an editor and research assistant at the former Research School of Social Sciences (RSSH) at ANU, initially for the Director of RSSH for one year and then for nine years at the Urban Research Program (URP), RSSH where I was the contributing editor of the *URP Newsletter*.
